Assemblyman Hagman Fights for Transparency in Election Recount Funding Hagman's Bill Ensuring Disclosure of Election Recount Funds Passes Assembly

SACRAMENTO – Today, Assemblyman Curt Hagman's (R-Chino Hills), Assembly Bill 2369, which ensures accountability and transparency in the way election recounts are funded, passed the Assembly on a 59-6 vote.

"I am pleased that my colleagues realized the need to clarify current law, which states that the person requesting a recount has to deposit the funds to pay for it, but does not specify where those funds may come from," stated Assemblyman Hagman. "This bill will prevent direct third-party contributions, thereby making sure voters know not only who is requesting a recount, but also how it is being funded," Hagman continued.

AB 2369 explicitly states that payment for a recount has to be provided by the voter's personal funds, funds from the voter's controlled campaign committee, or funds from a committee formed primarily to support or oppose a candidate or ballot measure. This ensures transparency, since all of these committees are required to disclose contributions to the Fair Political Practices Commission.
